


# Review of the National Framework for Medical Internship

# Part 1

# Consultation paper: Review and development work

The AMC is reviewing the National Framework for Medical Internship on behalf of the Medical Board of Australia. In line with the confirmed review scope, the AMC is now consulting on the first part of review and development work.

The National Framework for Medical Internship, implemented in 2014, replaced state-based internship requirements and complemented new national registration requirements of the Medical Board of Australia.



The review scope has been expanded to include developing a two-year Capability and Performance Framework, including Entrustable Professional Activities (EPAs), and e-portfolio specifications on behalf of the Australian Health Ministers' Advisory Council (AHMAC). This work arose from the Health Ministers' response to the recommendations

of the 2015 COAG Review of Medical Internship.

This consultation paper provides an overview of the Framework review process. **Part 2: Consultation questions** provides a description of concepts for consultation and a template of questions for feedback.



### Review process: Where is the review up to?

The AMC's review process will include multiple opportunities for stakeholders to engage. A summary of the review process, status and development work is provided below. A detailed timeline of the review is available on the website.



**Phase 1:** scoping & evaluation, is complete. A summary of the confirmed review scope is provided in a communique sent to stakeholders in April, available on the <u>AMC website</u>. In 2020 the AMC has commenced **Phase 2** of the review. A high level summary of the proposed revised two-year framework and packages of work is provided below.

The AMC will follow its standard consultation process for the review of accreditation standards. It will include a range of opportunities for seeking feedback, including:

- <u>Formal six-week consultation:</u> Consultation documentation sent to key stakeholders requesting feedback.
- Workshop sessions: Small group (Zoom) workshops will be held with relevant and interested stakeholder groups.
- <u>Presentations to key stakeholder groups</u>: The AMC will continue to organise opportunities for presentation and discussion with key stakeholder groups.
