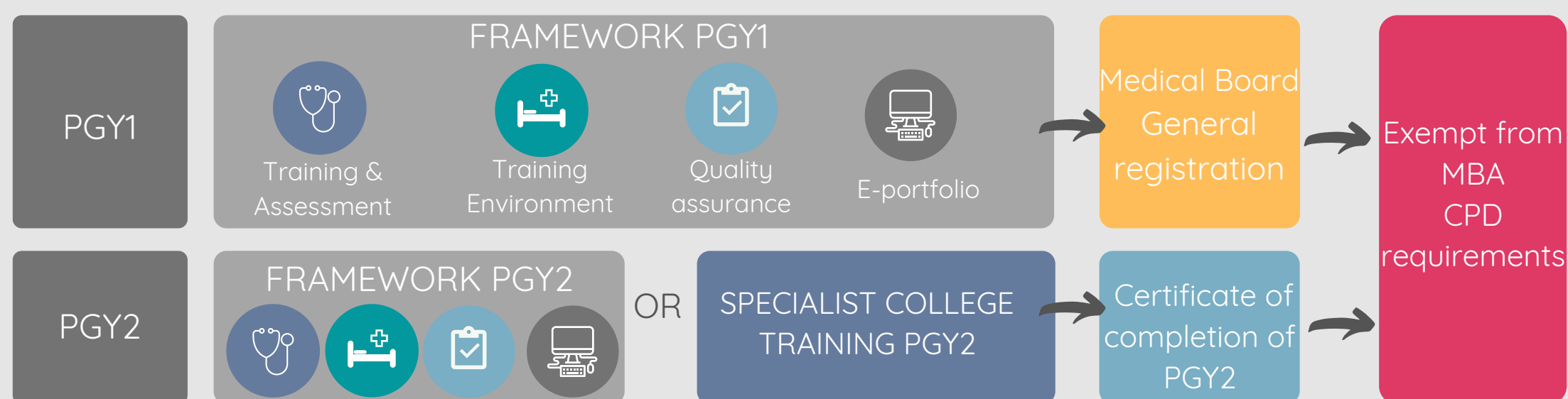




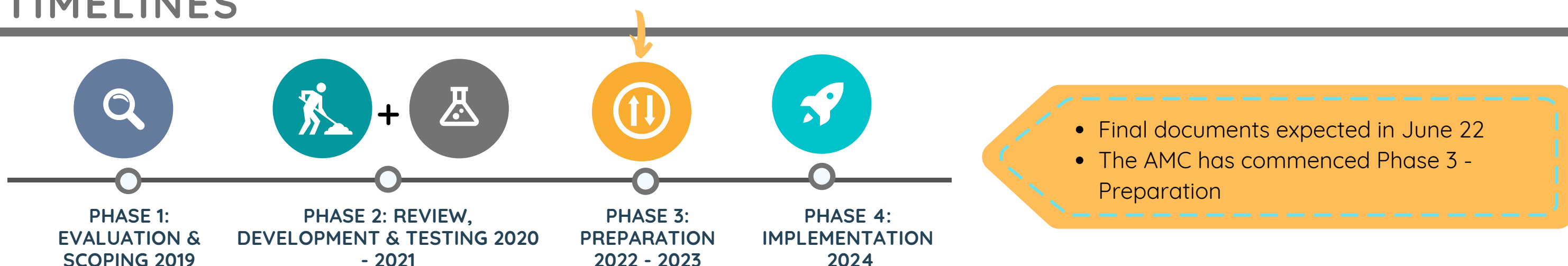
TAKEAWAY POINTS - AMC FRAMEWORK REVIEW

REVISED TWO-YEAR **PREVOCATIONAL** FRAMEWORK

- AMC is developing a two-year Framework on behalf of the Medical Board of Australia and Health Chief Executive Forum.
- Point of General Registration remains at the end of PGY1.
- Entry into specialist training in PGY2 is still permitted
- PGY1 & PGY2 in Framework exempt from MBA CPD requirements.
