Expressions of interest: seeking Emergency Medicine representative for the AMC WBA Results Panel

The Australian Medical Council is an independent national standards body for medical education. Its purpose is to ensure that standards of education, training and assessment of the medical profession promote and protect the health of the Australian community. The AMC is Australia's designated accreditation authority for the medical profession and works with the Medical Council of New Zealand on the accreditation of programs in New Zealand. The AMC assesses International Medical Graduates who are embarking on the standard pathway for registration as a doctor in Australia.

The AMC is seeking expressions of interest for a member in the speciality of Emergency Medicine to join as a member of the WBA Results panel. The member must demonstrate the following-

- Leadership in medical education and thorough knowledge of assessment standards in Australian medical education.
- Experience and qualification in Emergency Medicine
 - Fellowship of FACEM or equivalent
- Have full and current registration with the Medical Board of Australia.

Overview of the WBA Results Panel

The WBA Results Panel is one of three such groups established within the Assessment Committee structure to perform specific functions in connection with the conduct of the AMC examination processes. The WBA Results Panel is responsible for the confirmation of results for the AMC Workplace-based Assessment (WBA) program.

The role of the WBA Results Panel is to:

- Review the assessment outcomes of the AMC accredited Workplace-based Assessment program providers and to confirm the results of the individual candidates who have participated in the WBA assessment
- Provide feedback to the accredited WBA providers on the delivery of the WBA program
- Liaise with the AMC Pre-Vocational Accreditation Committee (PreVAC) on the assessment outcomes of the accredited WBA programs as required.
- Report to the Assessment Committee on the WBA assessment as required.

To ensure the AMC meets its strategic goal of ensuring culturally safe practice to improve health outcomes, the AMC understands that we require Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Māori Peoples in our governance. The AMC is committed to a working environment that is inclusive and culturally safe for all. The AMC encourages Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Māori Peoples to apply for all roles advertised.

Time Commitment

Chairs and Members of AMC panels are appointed for four-year terms. The WBA Results Panel will meet at least five times each year – by video conference. The meeting times vary from 3 – 6 hours depending on the number of assessments for confirmation.

Arrangements by the AMC to support Chairs and members

The AMC will -

- provide induction support for members
- pay a fee to members for participation in meetings of committees
- pays superannuation for individual members as required under Superannuation Guarantee legislation
- arranges and meets the cost of necessary accommodation and travel, where required

The AMC is committed to memberships that have a range of skills and experiences, diversity and different geographical locations and levels of academic, clinical or professional expertise

How to apply

To nominate for the position, candidates must complete and return the Expression of Interest Form along with their CV by COB, **Friday 25 November 2022**. All applications will be reviewed by an AMC Selection Panel and shortlisted candidates invited to participate in an interview.
