What is the International Medical Graduate Experiences Survey?

- A survey of international medical graduates who have started or completed the process required to practise medicine in Australia.
- The survey is part of broader project being carried out by the Australian Medical Council designed to understand better the journeys that international medical graduates take to practise medicine in Australia, and the contribution that they make once they are in the workforce.
- The broader project includes focus groups and interviews with international medical graduates, supervisors, health services, education providers and other health industry stakeholders who work with international medical graduates.
- The information from the survey, interviews and focus groups will provide a deeper understanding of the needs, expectations and challenges faced by international medical graduates.

Why do the survey?

- Your response will help to:
 - improve the experiences of international medical graduates
 - streamline processes for international medical graduates
 - identify what further supports are needed to build a strong and responsive workforce that meets the health needs of Australian communities.

How long will the survey take?

- The survey will take 10-15 minutes. You can return to the survey at a later time if you don't complete all of the questions at once.

Who can do the survey?

- International medical graduates who have started or completed the process required to practise medicine in Australia.

What will happen with the results?

- The results of the survey will be published on the AMC website and distributed to a broad range of stakeholders.
- The results may also be published in reports, academic journal articles and presented at conferences.
- The survey is anonymous and secure.
- No one will be able to identify you in the survey data or published results.
