The Australian Medical Council (AMC) is an independent national medical education and training standards body. Its purpose is to ensure that standards of education, training, and assessment of the medical profession promote and protect the health of the Australian community.

The AMC is Australia's accreditation authority for the medical profession and works with the Medical Council of New Zealand on the accreditation of medical programs in New Zealand. It is committed to improving outcomes for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islanders by assessing International Medical Graduates who are embarking on the standard pathway for registration as a doctor in Australia.

The AMC is committed to Cultural Safety as both a core organisational value and a strategic pillar, embedding it across its work to ensure respectful, inclusive, and culturally responsive practices in all aspects of health workforce assessment and development.

The AMC seeks expressions of interest from Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander individuals to join its Assessment Committee.

This is an exciting opportunity to contribute to the quality, fairness, and cultural safety of medical education and assessment in Australia. The AMC is committed to ensuring that its standards and processes reflect the diversity of the Australian community and support culturally safe medical practice.

The Role of the Assessment Committee

The Assessment Committee (the Committee) is a standing committee of the Australian Medical Council (AMC), established under the Constitution of the Australian Medical Council Limited to perform functions related to the assessment of International medical graduates for the purposes of registration.

The Committee oversees the AMC's processes for assessing the performance and competence of medical practitioners trained overseas and the accreditation of medical schools and programs in Australia and New Zealand.

We are seeking additional Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Members for this Committee, to bring valuable cultural insight and lived experience to the Committee's work, with a focus on -

- Promoting culturally safe assessment practices
- Supporting the inclusion of Indigenous perspectives in medical education and assessment
- Providing advice on fairness and equity in assessment frameworks.

Time Commitment

Members of the Assessment Committee are appointed for four-year terms. The Committee is scheduled to meet three to four times per year. Meetings will mainly occur via videoconference, with the potential for some face-to-face meetings.

Arrangements by the AMC to support Chairs and members

The AMC will -

- Provides induction support for members
- Pays a fee to members for participation in meetings of committees
- Pays superannuation for individual members as required under Superannuation Guarantee legislation
- Arranges and meets the cost of necessary accommodation and travel
- Meets the cost of meals and incidental expenditure, such as taxi fares.

The AMC does not pay for time spent responding to correspondence (e.g., emails and phone calls) from AMC staff.

How to apply

All applications will be reviewed by an AMC Selection Panel comprising at least two Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander representatives. Shortlisted candidates will be invited to interview.
