Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Members with demonstrated leadership or experience in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander health and/or medical education to join the AMC Clinical Assessment Panel or the AMC MCQ Assessment Panel

The Australian Medical Council (AMC) is an independent national medical education and training standards body. Its purpose is to ensure that standards of education, training, and assessment of the medical profession promote and protect the health of the Australian community.

The AMC is committed to improving outcomes for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islanders by assessing International Medical Graduates who are embarking on the standard pathway for registration as a doctor in Australia.

The AMC is committed to Cultural Safety as both a core organisational value and a strategic pillar, embedding it across its work to ensure respectful, inclusive, and culturally responsive practices in all aspects of health workforce assessment and development.

The AMC seeks expressions of interest from Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander individuals to join its Clinical Assessment Panel (CAP) and/or MCQ Assessment Panel (MAP).

This is an exciting opportunity to contribute to the quality, fairness, and cultural safety of medical education and assessment in Australia. The AMC is committed to ensuring that its standards and processes reflect the diversity of the Australian community and support culturally safe medical practice.

The Role of the Clinical and MCQ Assessment Panels

The Clinical and MCQ Assessment Panels bring together subject matter experts to evaluate and develop the assessment instruments for the AMC - the Clinical Examination and the CAT MCQ Examination. These panels provide reports, technical advice and recommendations on best practice for the Assessment Committee, which is a standing committee of the AMC.

We are seeking additional Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Members for these Panels, to bring valuable cultural insight and lived experience to the work of the Panels, with a focus on -

- Supporting the integration of cultural safety and Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander health into the MCQ program, including ensuring the AMC Cultural Safety Writing Guide framework is followed
- Promoting culturally safe assessment practices
- Supporting the inclusion of Indigenous perspectives in medical education and assessment
- Providing advice on fairness and equity in assessment frameworks.

Time Commitment

Members of the Clinical Assessment Panel or MCQ Assessment Panel are appointed for four-year terms. The Panels are each scheduled to meet approximately four times per year. Meetings will occur either face-to-face or via videoconference.

Arrangements by the AMC to support Chairs and members

The AMC will -

- Provide induction support for members
- Pay a fee to members for participation in meetings
- Pay superannuation for individual members as required under Superannuation Guarantee legislation
- Arrange and meet the cost of necessary accommodation and travel
- Meet the cost of meals and incidental expenditure, such as taxi fares.

The AMC does not pay for time spent responding to correspondence (e.g., emails and phone calls) from AMC staff.

The contributions of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and Māori Peoples are vital to ensuring that AMC assessments are fair, relevant, and culturally responsive.

We recognise the importance of incorporating diverse perspectives to ensure our assessments reflect the needs of all communities, including Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and Māori Peoples.

The AMC is actively embedding cultural safety principles into its assessment processes and decision-making to promote equitable outcomes and improve health care delivery for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and Māori Peoples. All AMC writing group members use cultural safety frameworks to guide the writing process.

We are committed to increasing Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander representation and ensuring culturally respectful engagement across all aspects of our work

All applications will be reviewed by an AMC Selection Panel comprising at least two Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander representatives. Shortlisted candidates will be invited to interview.
